Advance notice – Alternative Arrangements for the Start of the College Day on Wednesday 27 November

To aid our preparedness for cold weather over the coming months, we will be trialling some alternative arrangements for students arriving to College on Wednesday 27 November. This is to ensure that we have the procedures in place to make certain that every student who arrives on a day when snow may need to be cleared from walkways, has safe access to the site, thereby reducing the likelihood of future snow closures.

On Wednesday 27 November, only two entrances to the College will be available - the usual Barossa pedestrian entrance and doors to the front of Kingston building - accessed through the Kingston car park entrance gate. Therefore, pedestrians should be aware that access to the site on Wednesday 27 November will not be available through Ballard gate as this will remain locked.

Many thanks in advance for supporting these alternative arrangements. We apologise for any inconvenience caused, but this is a necessary run through of how such a morning may pan out ahead of inevitable snow days in the future. For that morning and also future snow days, students arriving late as a result of this 'detour' will not be marked late.

A further reminder will be sent via EduLink nearer the time.

Holiday Dates for 25-26 Academic Year

I am sure all parents and carers will agree that the first half term of the academic year is always the hardest - it is inevitably the longest and the time when coughs and colds can impact significantly on student and staff attendance. We have therefore decided that for the next academic year we are going to use two of our Additional College Day Closures to shorten the first half term and lengthen the October half term holiday (by two days) rather than at the end of the academic year in July.

This will mean that the last day of the half term will be Wednesday 22 October. Half term holiday will begin on Thursday 23 October and will end on Friday 31 October.

After enjoying the lovely sunshine in Rotterdam, we made our way back to the hotel for the students to set off for their first training session at Feyenoord's training ground. As with all football tours the students arrived at an outstanding training facility with multiple 4G pitches. The students quickly changed and were greeted by the Feyenoord coaches in readiness for their first session. The 90 minutes seemed to fly by with all students fully engrossed in what the Feyenoord coaches were teaching them.





After training we set off to our first activity of bowling. There were certainly some interesting bowling techniques on display throughout the afternoon but unfortunately it was Mrs San Emeterio that took the wooden spoon in the staff game, and I was not quite sure about the students. The last outing of our first day was to the AZ Alkmar stadium where we watched AZ play Go Ahead Eagles. This was quite possibly one of the best pre match build ups I have ever seen with strobe lighting and dance music getting the crowd ready for the match. The game itself was a very entertaining 2-2 draw. What an end to our first full day in Holland.

Day 3 began with an 8.00am breakfast and a 9.00am pick up ready to travel to Efteling Theme Park. Students and most of the staff were very excited to take in all the rides at the theme park. Unfortunately, Mr Saunders had made it known before the trip that he did not like rollercoasters so after quite a bit of persuasion we did manage to get him on one ride during the day, a very good achievement for himself.





After a full day of theme park rides, we travelled to RVVH Football Club for our first set of fixtures against Dutch opposition. The girls and the U14 boys played first and looked incredibly smart in their brand-new tour strip. The girls played some fantastic football throughout their game and managed to secure a 3-1 win. The pick of the goals was from Chloe Edwards a solo run sitting down both defenders and the goalie. Next up the U16 and U15 teams played their first games. The U16 team had a very good game against a strong opposition, unfortunately finishing with a 3-2 loss on the night. The winning goal was a very dubious penalty decision which I explained to the boys that, at times, especially playing away from home, you will get these decisions. The U15s also had a very close game, unfortunately losing 1-0 in the end. This was an incredibly long day for all

students, but they all acquitted themselves incredibly well and were certainly ready for bed when we arrived at the hotel around 10.00pm.

Another early start for Day 4 and the daily Starbucks run for staff as well as quite a few students by this point. Mr Andrews then took a call from the rep to say that training would be a little different this day as the Feyenoord 1st team were due to make an appearance to meet and greet their fans before the big derby game against Ajax on the Wednesday. Sebastian, the rep, said they were expecting a few thousand people so



rather excitedly we boarded the coaches and made our way to our final training session. Once arrived, the students quickly changed and made their way out to training. Whilst the students were training, Mr Andrews and Mr Cleary made their way to the Feyenoord stadium to pick up a few things and whilst walking to the stadium and then back again they both soon realised that this event might be a little more than they initially thought.



Once the students had finished training, we made our way round to the main training pitch to be greeted by nearly 1500 Feyenoord fans who were letting off fireworks and flares in anticipation for the 1st team to come out on to the pitch. The most bizarre thing about all of this was that it was only 12.00pm in the middle of the day! As the Feyenoord 1st team took to the pitch, the atmosphere was like nothing I had ever seen before. More fireworks and red flares went up into the sky and music boomed across the pitch. Looking round at our students' faces told me everything I needed to know about just how amazing this was and something that came as a complete surprise. The Feyenoord 1st team proceeded to walk around the pitch, wave at the fans and

then leave after 20 minutes. Once they had left the pitch the fans soon followed and just like that it was completely silent again, a very surreal but amazing experience for our students.

Once the tour had finished, and a quick visit to the stadium shop, we were back on the coaches for the final games of the tour. The U14s and the Girls' team played Jodan and the U15s and U16s played VV Zwavulen. The girls once again came away with a brilliant victory and an excellent team



performance by all students. The U14s were also again successful in their game. The U16s had a more comfortable evening with a 7-0 victory and a notable hat trick from Charlie Cowler. The U15s unfortunately had a slightly tougher evening with a heavy loss. Once again, all games were played in excellent spirit and it was great to see all students embracing after the game and then all eating together.



On the final night of the tour, we had our usual presentation evening where each student was presented with a very nice Feyenoord bag, pen and pin badge. There were also many other awards given, in recognition of students' achievements that week, whether it was for scoring a hat-trick, man of the match award, most memorable moment or even riding your first rollercoaster!

The final day came and an early start for all meant we were up and out by 8.30am and on our way to Calais for the journey home. We had a very good journey home and made it back to Collingwood surprisingly early which never

usually happens. To summarise, the football tour was once again an amazing 5 days away with an excellent group of students. Taking 72 students can always be a daunting task, but I must pay particular thanks to the 7 other staff who joined me: Mr Cleary, Mrs San Emeterio, Mr Beer, Mr Jarmyn, Mrs Goggin, Mr San Emeterio and Mr Saunders. Without these members of staff giving up their half term the trip would not have happened.

The next tour is already being planned so any student currently in Years 7, 8 or 9 please keep your eyes peeled for April 2025 when details will be released.
