ATTENDANCE - LEAVE OF ABSENCE/ HOLIDAY REQUESTS

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority, they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.

GOLD PARTICIPANTS SHOW TRUE METTLE ON DOFE QUALIFYING EXPEDITION

Getting ready for Gold DofE expeditions takes months and sometimes years of training physically and organisationally. The four Gold Year 13 students had the added battle of some of the most difficult weather conditions ever seen and having to change venue to a completely different terrain with a month's notice.





They showed true commitment in getting their expedition sections completed and battled very strong winds, torrential rain, hail, storms, thunder, lightning and raging rivers to walk, camp and cook when completely drenched.

This year the Gold Qualifying team had to change venue at the last minute to move to Dartmoor from Brecon, a very different part of the country. Their Assessor turned out to be a top ecological scientist, whose passion is preserving the rain forest of Dartmoor. So, their expedition project focus became a fact-finding mission



on all that is Dartmoor and what makes it the most special and fragile remaining rain forest in the UK.

Their final project was deemed to be one of the best he had ever seen, which was a testament to their conscientious work. They worked hard to do their research before they went and then answer the questions he had posed. They presented the final project to their parents, SLT and Governors on 7 May at Collingwood to complete their section.

The team had four days of walking and three nights of camping. Two of those nights were wild camping

with no facilities other than a raging river for water and washing up, and an open terrain for bathroom facilities. They were in a remote part of Dartmoor National Park, but what beautiful views they had.



As a group of only four they had to support each other and were always laughing through the terrible conditions to achieve what is an exceptional goal. With only a few other sections to complete they will be off to Buckingham Palace next year to receive their official awards. Huge congratulations to each and every one of them.

EXAM CERTIFICATES

Exam certificate postage payment is available on ParentPay. Please ensure payment is made as soon as possible to ensure your child receives their exam certificates for the summer 2024 season. This is of particular importance for those students in Years 11 and 13 who are leaving the College.

To avoid certificates being lost in transit or left crumpled at the bottom of a school bag, we encourage payment to be made for Years 9 and 10 too.

For those that make payment for postage, exam certificates are usually despatched in December using Royal Mail's 'Signed For' service.

Certificates will be required by future employers and further education institutes. If you do not have your certificates when you need them in later life, the exam boards can provide a replacement statement of results but it is very costly.
