We finished as the best in England and second best in the UK and overall, we were ranked 16<sup>th</sup> in the world with one of the team, Bethan Woods, ranked as 23<sup>rd</sup> best speaker in the world! Bethan is in Year 11 and was against mostly Year 13 students, so this is quite an achievement.

Well done to all involved - simply outstanding!

## **DEBATING NEWS ...**

#### National and International Finals at Oxford and Cambridge

This year Collingwood competed in the largest debating competition in the World, The Oxford Union Schools' Debating Competition along with the slightly smaller Cambridge Union Competition. Each of these competitions involved thousands of teams from around the globe, including teams from Dubai, South Korea, China, Canada, India, USA and much of Europe. Each of these teams will have competed in regional rounds hoping to earn the privilege of debating in historic Oxford and Cambridge Union Debating Chambers.





The Cambridge Competition involves competing in four regional rounds (held on the same day) and Oxford has two regional rounds. We knew that to attend either of these finals days was going to be difficult this year, particularly when we saw the draw for the regional rounds that included schools we normally do not meet until later in the competition.

We entered two teams for Cambridge and were delighted when our A Team (Bethan Wood and Adam Cox) made it through their four rounds. They took a particularly impressive win in round four against high calibre opponents and were one of only five teams from London and the Southeast to progress to finals day on Saturday 22 March at the Cambridge Union.

We entered four teams for Oxford who all competed in two back-to-back rounds against schools from the South of England. We were disappointed not to gain a place in these initial rounds but our A Team managed to gain a last minute place just days before Finals Day on Saturday 15 March.

Finals are particularly difficult and long days, and we left school just after 6.00am and returned at 1.00am after the Cambridge Finals. However, our students rose to both occasions and relished the opportunity to debate against such a wide array of international students as well as teams from across the British Isles.



In both Oxford and especially Cambridge we narrowly missed progressing to the International Final, but on both occasions we competed in the final for UK State schools. In Oxford we lost on a split decision to the Scottish champions and were delighted to have a rematch the following week in Cambridge against the same Scottish team, with the same result. It is a measure of our high expectations that to be only the best in England and second best in the UK was a position we would have to settle for. Overall, we ranked 16<sup>th</sup> in the world with Bethan Wood ranked as 23<sup>rd</sup> best speaker in the world. Bethan is in Year 11 and was against mostly Year 13 students so this is quite an achievement.

## FREE SCHOOL MEAL APPLICATIONS

**REMINDER** – there are only a few days left for you to complete and return your FSM application forms.

Full details are provided in the letter sent via email to all parents/carers today.

If you are already in receipt of Free School Meals, **NO ACTION IS REQUIRED**.

Any parents/carers who feel they may be eligible to receive Free School Meals, please complete the Application Form (also sent via email to all parents/carers today) and submit by MONDAY 31 MARCH 2025 to Mrs Moody, Barossa Office.

Please check the criteria below to see if you qualify for Free School Meals.

If you are in receipt of Universal Credit, you do not automatically qualify, <u>unless your annual</u> <u>net earned family income is no more than £7,400</u>.

#### Free School Meal Criteria:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned family income of no more than £7,400
- Income support
- Income based Jobseeker's Allowance (IBJSA)
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance (IRESA)
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual gross income of no more than £16,190, as assessed by HMRC. NB: If you receive WORKING TAX CREDIT you do NOT qualify even if you receive child tax credit and your income is below £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

## **EXAM CERTIFICATES**

Exam certificate postage payment is available on ParentPay. Please ensure payment is made as soon as possible to ensure your child receives their exam certificates for the Summer 2025 season. This is of particular importance for those students in Years 11 and 13 who are leaving the College.

To avoid certificates being lost in transit or left crumpled at the bottom of a school bag, we encourage payment to be made for Years 9 and 10 too.

For those that make payment for postage, exam certificates are usually despatched in December using Royal Mail's 'Signed For' service.

Certificates will be required by future employers and further education institutes. If you don't have your certificates when you need them in later life, the exam boards can provide a replacement statement of results, but it is very costly.

## DISCOVER UNIVERSITY SUMMER SCHOOL

#### Applications are now open!

The Discover University Residential Summer School, organised in partnership with the University of Surrey, will again take place at the University of Surrey campus in Guildford, from Monday 28 July until Thursday 31 July 2025.

The deadline for applications is Sunday 27 April. This year the summer school is open to Years 9, 10 and 11 students.

#### About the summer school

This summer school is fully funded and is available for 60 students in Years 9 to 11 who:

- Are a young carer
- ♦ Have current or previous experience of living within care
- Are a Surrey Scholar
- Attend one of our HEON partner schools.

This opportunity will enable students to gain an insight into the life of a student within a supportive environment, finding out what it is like to study at university by talking to current university students with similar experiences whilst trying their hand at a range of exciting subjects and activities. During the evenings there will be a variety of social activities held on the University campus, or in the surrounding area.

The summer school runs over four days and three nights and will give students the opportunity to stay in University accommodation with catering provided. However, if due to caring responsibilities students can only visit during the day, this can be arranged.

Summer schools regularly demonstrate very positive impact – both short-term (increasing attendees' knowledge and confidence about Higher Education (HE) as well as increased attainment) and long-term (increased progression rates to HE).

I very much appreciate your understanding and co-operation in adhering to these procedures and thank you for your support in maintaining positive College-parent/carer relationships.






