Heading into the event, Harvey was one of the favourites to take the title, having set a new track record at TeamSport Warrington just two weeks prior - breaking a long-standing record from the last national finals. Harvey began the event with a dominant performance, qualifying in P1 in his heat. He then cruised to victories in Heat 1 and Heat 2, before taking a commanding win in the Semi-final.

Starting the Final from second place, based on his lap-time in the Semi-final, Harvey showed maturity and skill under pressure, managing to secure second place at the chequered flag. This runner-up finish was a massive achievement, considering BIKC was confirmed by Motorsport UK as the largest motorsport event in the World by the number of participants!

Reminder – Alternative Arrangements for the Start of the College Day on Wednesday 27 November

To aid our preparedness for cold weather over the coming months, we will be trialling some alternative arrangements for students arriving to College on Wednesday 27 November. This is to ensure that we have the procedures in place to make certain that every student who arrives on a day when snow may need to be cleared from walkways, has safe access to the site, thereby reducing the likelihood of future snow closures.

Therefore, pedestrians should be aware that access to the site on Wednesday 27 November will not be available through Ballard gate as this will remain locked.

We apologise for any inconvenience caused, but this is a necessary run through of how such a morning may pan out ahead of inevitable snow days in the future. For that morning and also future snow days, students arriving late as a result of this 'detour' will not be marked late.

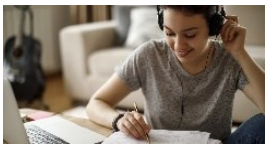

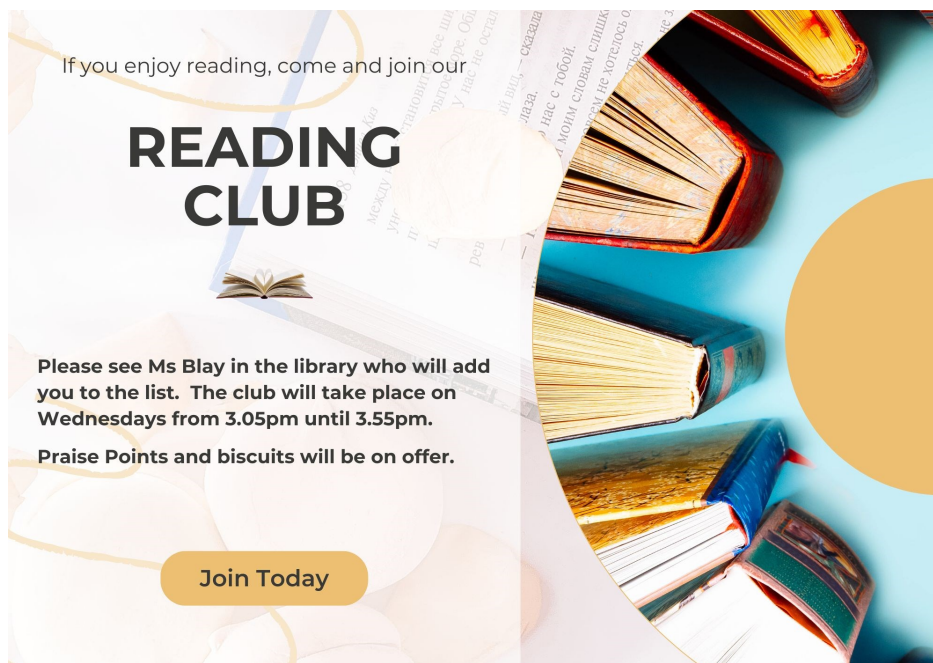
Overdue Library Books/DVDs
