EXAM CERTIFICATES

Exam certificate postage payment is available on ParentPay. Please ensure payment is made as soon as possible to ensure your child receives their exam certificates for the Summer 2025 season. This is of particular importance for those students in Years 11 and 13 who are leaving the College.

To avoid certificates being lost in transit or left crumpled at the bottom of a school bag, we encourage payment to be made for Years 9 and 10 too.

For those that make payment for postage, exam certificates are usually despatched in December using Royal Mail's 'Signed For' service.

Certificates will be required by future employers and further education institutes. If you don't have your certificates when you need them in later life, the exam boards can provide a replacement statement of results, but it is very costly.

I very much appreciate your understanding and co-operation in adhering to these procedures and thank you for your support in maintaining positive College-parent/carer relationships.











Suggested activities

- Ask students to list all the French-speaking countries they can think of. Then give them the full list (cf. below) and ask them to look those countries up on a map – or label and colour them in on a blank world map.
- Ask students to come up with a definition for the word "francophonie". Then look it up in an online dictionary to compare.
- List various contexts when someone may be required to communicate in French. E.g. buying something, reading information on a French website, writing to a pen pal, calling a French business partner...
- Watch the video "Parle-t-on français ailleurs dans le monde?" (1 jour, 1 question): https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Mnq9-BhdSvw Ask students to note down at least 5 facts they've understood from the video.
- Watch the video "La langue française dans le monde" (Organisation Internationale de la Francophonie): https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=0EP6g043AIM
 Ask students to discuss what they've found out from the video in groups.
 They could design a poster to compile the information in a visual way.
- In groups, students select a French-speaking country and they have to find a series of facts about its culture, food, customs, people, geography, etc. They then present their findings to the rest of the class in a short presentation.

To practice speaking French:

- Students make a list of French words used in the English language (e.g. chauffeur, souvenir, café...). They can then create a word cloud using the Wordle.net website.
- Ask students to brainstorm a list of words in English that ends in "-tion" (e.g. definition, ambition, revolution). Write all the words they've come up with on the board and point out to them most (if not all) of these words come from French. You can do the same with words ending in "-ment" (e.g. amusement, argument, commencement). This will help students realise how many words the two languages have in common. That's not surprising when it is estimated that between 40 and 50% of words used in English today originate in the French language.
- The Lie-Detector: Each student writes 4 or 5 sentences about themselves, including one that they made up. They read the sentences to the rest of the class who must decide which statement is untrue.
- French Expressions with "comme": This simple game will allow students to discover idiomatic expressions using the word "comme" with practicing a set of transferrable skills.

Photocopy the set of expressions on card. You may want to laminate it for durability. Then cut out the different boxes. Give out the cards with "être + adjective" to students. In groups, they should ensure they know the meaning of all the adjectives, using a dictionary when needed. Then give out the cards with "comme..." and ask them to match each one to the correct adjective. They should try to match as many pairs as possible without using a dictionary as some will be obvious (e.g. "être rouge comme une tomate"). They can then check the meaning of the words the are unfamiliar with to work out the rest of the pairs.

Once all the pairs have been correctly matched, ask students to think of their English equivalents. This will help them understand that word-for-word translations do not always make sense. Some cultural understanding of both languages is necessary to translate accurately.

Tip for differentiation: You may want to use a limited number of pairs depending of the ability and level of your students.

Extension work: Ask students to use they creativity and invent expressions for other adjectives (e.g. être paresseux/travailleur/dynamique/maladroit comme...). Alternatively you can use verbs instead of adjectives (courir/manger/chanter/sauter comme...)


